### How do we show that we are FOR Pinellas?

Being FOR Pinellas means reaching out to our community and showing them what God's love is all about. It also means lifting up the people in our community who are making Pinellas a great place to be! Some of the ways that you can show that we're FOR Pinellas:

### #FORPINELLAS

If you have a social media account, share the positive things you see in our community, or positive things you're doing, with the hashtag #FORpinellas. This might mean posting about the customer service you got that was above and beyond, or a local business that you've seen doing something positive for the community. 
Handicapable Ministry Hosts Respite Summit
Thursday, June 15, the St. Paul Handicapable Ministry
hosted FLRA's (Florida Lifespan Respite Alliance) first
summit. FLRA works to make respite resources more
available and accessible to caregivers of all ages in Florida. This gives caregivers the break they need to refresh
them physically, mentally, and emotionally, so that they
can continue to provide great care. Over 50 representatives from national, state and local agencies were joined
by area caregivers for a full day of reports and action sessions. The goals of the summit were: to expand the
statewide voice of FLRA by including input from regional
hubs; to identify respite service gaps by region, age and

disability; to initiate a process of statewide collaboration that will eventually lead to a more coordinated system of respite care. By its close, the summit met all of these goals.

Many thanks to DeDe VanHooser and her team of St. Paul ladies, who decorated the room, and prepared lunch and served the attendees with caring smiles!
