
IGNITE: Young Adults & Young Professionals

Hurricane Preparedness

With Hurricane Harvey creating havoc in eastern Texas and southern Louisiana, it's a good reminder to all of us that we need to be ready for a hurricane should it hit the Bay area. Here are some key things suggested by Bay News 9 that you can do *today* to be prepared.

Prepare an emergency kit – Build an emergency kit including food, water, medical needs and important documents. Put in waterproof containers. Items to include:

- o Flashlights
- o Bottled water (1 gallon/person/day)
- o Battery-operated radio
- o Bottled Juice
- o Batter-operated lanterns
- o Two coolers drinks/food
- o Matches
- o Canned Foods
- o First Aid Kit
- o Manual can opener
- o Clock
- o Get extra cash
- o Plastic garbage bags
- o Soap/Shampoo/Hygiene items
- o Scissors
- o Insurance Policy number/claim phone #
- o Heavy gloves
- o Thermometer
- o Clean clothes
- o Tweezers
- o Extra blankets & Pillows
- o Sunscreen

Make a communication plan – Make sure your family knows how to get in touch with each other if you are separated. Have a discussion to determine who would be your out-of-state point of contact and make sure everyone has a cell phone so you can communicate with others and let them know you are safe.

Learn evacuation routes - Determine where you would go and how to get there.

Let's all be prepared so we have the best case scenarios should a major storm come our way!
