


Valentine's Social: Saturday, Feb. 3 at 6 p.m.


Sunday Morning: Lil' Kidz Care

If you have any used cold weather clothes for men, women and children or any extra blankets you can donate, we welcome any good condition items. UMW Ditty Bag Project

One of the ways the United Methodist Women serve is by providing ditty bags with personal items for the homeless and migrant workers in our community. You can help with this project by donating personal care and other
