Tuesday, January 23, St. Paul was the site of a successful Senior Empowerment Day led by the Largo City Police Senior Services Division (Officer Joel Quattlebaum) and Aging in America Advocacy Conferences (Karyn Rizzo). The 250 plus attendees, which included several St. Paul church members, learned about senior safety, identity theft, elder law, and other topics for successful aging.
