
These are cornerstones of the Scouting Program that we remember as our scouts take part in worship today.



Jumpstart is our middle school mentoring ministry for the students of Largo Middle School. This school is a very diverse, Title I middle school where students could use extra encouragement and tutoring in a safe environment.

We're looking for volunteers to fill the following roles:

Adult Supervisors

The Adult Supervisor's role is to oversee high school tutors, middle school students and to interact with both. An education background is not required, just a willingness to get to know students and to help where they can. We also need adults to help serve dinner and clean up, and to oversee games and recreation in the gym.

Commitment: Volunteer on Tuesday afternoon/evenings from 3:30-6:00 p.m. We'd like adults to serve at least two times per month.

Adult Supervisor schedule each week:

3:30-4:45 p.m. - Weekly meeting with Alison, Pastor Pam, and the high school tutors. Help set up the classroom and snack.

4:45-5:00 p.m. - Welcome middle school students, serve snack, talk with students about their week.

5:00-6:00 p.m. - Tutoring led by high school students. Adult supervisors oversee and provide assistance and support.

We're also looking for adults for the following:

6:00-6:30 p.m. - Help serve dinner and clean up.

6:30-7:30 p.m. - Be present for recreation activities in the gym.

High school tutors

Tutors must have at least one advanced or AP class. Students can use their volunteer time towards the Bright Futures scholarship, which requires community service, or for National Honors Society hours.

Student tutor time commitment possibilities:

3:30-6:00 p.m. - Weekly meeting and tutoring.


3:30-6:30 p.m.- Weekly meeting, tutoring and dinner.

Valentine's Social Raises \$1,800

This year's Valentine's Social raised \$1,800 for families dealing with pediatric cancer! Ninety-six attended the event, which included dancing, a delicious dinner, and a silent auction of gift baskets to raise more funds for the families of critically ill children. Everyone had a lot of fun dancing and spending time together.

The money raised goes to Tyler's Meals and Miles, which was created by the Gray family in honor of Tyler Gray, who succumbed to complications from Acute Myeloid Leukemia when he

was 18. His parents know first hand what a difference gift cards can make when you are travelling back and forth from the hospital, or staying there for an extended period of treatment. Tyler's dad drove 23 miles each way every morning and evening, and Tyler's mom spent 160 days on a pull out couch. Travel, food and other expenses add up. During some of their hospital visits they received gift cards to help cover gas or meal expenses, and it made a difference. Now they are paying it forward with Tyler's Meals and Miles to provide gift cards to the families of critically ill children.
