
Join our Student Ministry for an amazing summer!

Handicapable Ministry
St. Paul's Handicapable Ministry has been serving God's "Special People" for more than 20 years! We welcome anyone over 16 years old with cognitive or physical disabilities to join our ministry. Every person is encouraged to discover their confidence and experience God's love. Our year round program provides weekly worship services on Weds. at 6:15 p.m. and social activities like parties, retreats, and sporting

Missions and Outreach

Our Missions and Outreach Ministry Team is involved in mission projects overseas and in our community. This year, among other projects, we will host our 6th Annual Back to School Jubilee. Last year we provided shoes, backpacks and school supplies to 425 kids. Generous donations and over a hundred volunteers help make this event possible.



We also distributed 1,440 bags of food through Pack-a-Sack, filled flood buckets for hurricane relief, helped clean up the Largo Nature Preserve, and are involved in other outreach like feeding the homeless each Sunday in Clearwater.



Stephen Ministry

Stephen Ministers have been trained to provide one-to-one, confidential, Christian care to hurting people in the congregation and the community. Open Arms Ministry

Open Arms Resource Center

St. Paul believes Jesus calls us to help our brothers and sisters when they are in need. Open Arms offers food and clothing, financial assistance for rent and utilities when available, and spiritual support. This ministry currently serves about 4,000 people every month and provides food to other ministries and food pantries in our area as well. Last year Open Arms distributed 348,000 pounds of food to the underfed! Later this year Open Arms will move to our new Druid Campus at 2039 Druid Rd. in Clearwater.




How You Can Help

The Carpenter's Shop

The Carpenter's Shop makes wooden toys that are given to children who are dealing with traumatic situations. We give the toys to first responders and others in our community who work with children in crisis. When they come in contact with children who are dealing with traumas or emotionally difficult situations, the toys offer some needed comfort and love. OUR NEXT MESSAGE SERIES: HEAD ON

What's in our hearts, good or bad, eventually translates into words and deeds. There are certain emotions that can poison our hearts, our relationships and our lives unless we confront them head on.

APRIL 8 – CONFRONTING GUILT

We often have thoughts that go something like this: *"If only I had..."* These thoughts come from guilt over actions we've taken, or worse yet, inactions. How do we let the past go? Is there such a thing as a cure for guilt?

APRIL 15 – CONFRONTING ANGER

When our anger gets the best of us it can leave a trail of destruction in its path. Behind all the ranting and raving, the real problem is usually that we aren't getting our way. What does God have to say about confronting anger?

APRIL 22 – CONFRONTING GREED

Greedy people have an oversized sense of ownership and a need to control more and more possessions, but oftentimes that greed is driven by fear. What would happen to greed if we could let go of fear?

APRIL 29 – CONFRONTING JEALOUSY

We've all fallen into the trap of comparing ourselves to others at some time or another, but what if jealousy is less about "keeping up with the Joneses" and more about what we think God owes us? Does God actually owe us anything?
