

Help with the Pumpkin Patch

Our Student Ministry is taking the lead in running the patch again this year, but some of the money they raise is also going toward the church's budget and they can use the church's help with setting up the tent and unloading pumpkins, as well as taking shifts to run the patch.

Tent Setup is next Sunday, Sept. 23 at noon. Join us after 10:30 a.m. worship in the old Open Arms lot. Putting up the large pumpkin patch tent is a big job and strong muscles are needed. Any and all help is appreciated.

Pumpkin Unload is Saturday, Oct. 6 at 11 a.m. Help unload thousands of pumpkins from the semi-truck. Pizza will be provided. We're hoping for 60-70 volunteers. The more people help, the faster the unload goes and the more fun it is, so come and bring a few friends. Wear clothes that can get dirty and bring a reusable water bottle. Some people also bring gardening gloves.

Sign up for a Shift at the Patch. You can sign up to take a shift at the patch on the board in the sanctuary lobby. Our students receive money in their Student Ministry accounts for working shifts, but we need at least one adult during each shift.

Approximately 7,000 children under the age of 18 experience chronic hunger in Pinellas County. These children have free or reduced lunches during the school week, but often go hungry over the weekend. Pack-a-Sack provides bags of food for these children to eat on the weekend.
