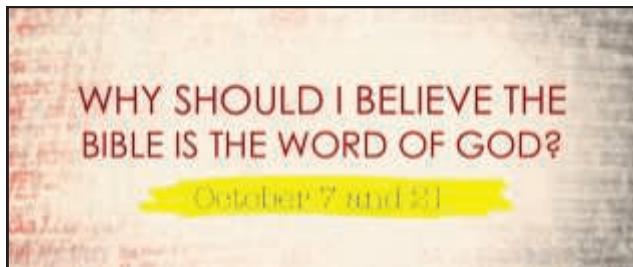

Help with the Pumpkin Patch

Our Student Ministry is taking the lead in running the patch again this year, but some of the money they raise is also going toward the church's budget and they can use the church's help with unloading pumpkins, as well as taking shifts to run the patch.

Jumpstart Inspires Students and Tutors

As a new year of Jumpstart begins, take a look at this interview with one of our Jumpstart tutors, Payton Daniele, pictured above right. The full article about the Jumpstart program can be found online: www.fumf.org/category/news/

Volunteer tutor Payton Daniele, 18, a senior at Palm Harbor University High School, logged 88 hours in the program's first year and hopes to increase that this year. Daniele says she got involved because she was "gifted by God" with excelling in academics and wanted to use that gift in helping others. It turned out to be a life-changing experience for the teen. "I think I got more out of it than the kids I worked with," she says.

At the retreat weekend, Daniele says it was a "thrill" to be part of a bridge between church and community and witness some of the kids getting their first exposure to an authentic faith experience.

It made such an impact on her that she is shelving long-time plans to study science and education in college and instead pursue a calling in ministry. Daniele is planning to attend Palm Beach Atlantic University, a Christian college that offers both bachelor's and master's degrees in divinity.

And she's added another goal to her life plan: Daniele wants to run her own Jumpstart program one day. "When you help children grow both academically and spiritually, you're making a difference that can dramatically change their lives in such a meaningful way," she says. "I feel that's right where I belong."
