





Help Keep the Prayer List Current

Screen Time and Children: Finding a Healthy Balance

As a mother and a Preschool Director I often find myself discussing the issue of screen time and how much is too much for children. There are those that say there should be no screen time and there are those that say screen time does not need to be limited. I have heard the perspective of both sides, and I have done research myself. I firmly agree that screen time should be limited for children; however, I also realize that all children are different and each family is different. I think the best approach for parents is to find a healthy balance of activities for their children, so that some screen time can be incorporated into day to day life.

I am a huge advocate of a child learning how to play a musical instrument. The cost of renting an instrument and lessons is surprisingly cost effective, and the benefits well outweigh the costs. There is quite a bit of research to back up the link between cognitive development and the ability to read and play music. This activity also includes regular daily practice times that take a **child's attention away from screen time and focus it on something more positive.** If you are an advocate of increased use of current technology, there are even apps that monitor practice times and rate of accuracy during play. My son currently uses one for his band practice.

Another great resource for activities is your church. Here at St. Paul United Methodist Church we are blessed with amazing programs for our youth. Our Treehouse Ministry has wonderful activities year round for younger children to participate in. For our teens our Lighthouse Ministry is packed with various service activities and retreats. Our children and student ministries also run through the summer months as well, which all parents know can be an easy time for screen time to increase.

All the research agrees that limiting screen time is the best idea for children and teens. As with all things in life, striking a healthy balance is the key. Search out local recreation centers for various classes and sporting events, look into scouting for both boys and girls, or try out some of the options I have listed above.
