

October is Pastor Appreciation Month, and a good reminder to express our appreciation to our pastors. But rather than confine our appreciation to one date, below are a few ongoing ways we can show our appreciation.

PRAY FOR THEM

One of the greatest gifts you can give your pastors is prayer. Pray that the Lord will keep them and guide them. Pray that they will persevere in life and doctrine. Pray for their bodily and spiritual health. As you pray for your pastors, you will find yourself loving them more and more.

SHARE A LETTER OF SUPPORT

Share a letter (or an email) with your pastor, letting them know you support them, expressing the difference they have made in your life, or letting them know what their ministries mean to you. Pastors often receive criticism, and hear less often from those who support them, so a personal note means a great deal.

IMITATE THEIR FAITH

The writer of Hebrews challenges us to imitate our leaders. Of course, this is also a challenge for leaders to be imitable and does not mean our pastors are perfect, as Jesus is the only perfect One. But this does mean we can learn from our pastors and put into practice the faith we see displayed in them.

FOLLOW THEIR LEAD

The Lord gives our pastors unique gifts and a specific passion for the churches they serve and the communities they serve in. Their passion, sense of mission, and specific gifting will and should impact the direction of the church.

A pastor never "clocks out." A pastor is a pastor all of the time. The responsibility is enormous as, to quote Martyn Lloyd-Jones, the pastor "is given charge of souls." Let's encourage, love, and support our pastors as they seek to fulfill all the duties of their ministries.



We have a wonderful group of faithful volunteers who help with our Open Arms Ministry. One of these giving people is Anne Louise Schafner. About two years ago, there was an Open Arms distribution at Crosspointe Church and Anne came over to ask what was going on. That one moment of curiosity changed her life in wonderful ways.
