





"Who Needs Christmas?"

Seriously, who needs it? Well, as it turns out, maybe we all do. In this series, we'll discover just how important the Christmas story really is—for all of us.



TONIGHT: God needed Christmas to demonstrate His love.

We all tend to think of Christmas as a holiday that's *about* God, but not really *for* God. After all, Christmas is really *for us*, right? The truth is, the first Christmas wasn't just *for people*—it was *for God* as well. This week, we'll discover that while the world need Christmas to understand God's love, God needed it, too.

Confirmation Informational Meeting Tonight 5 p.m. | Mariposa Cafe Our next Confirmation Class begins in January. The nine week class is open to students in Grade 6 and above. It challenges

students to ask deep questions about the Bible, our Methodist beliefs, and their own lives as people of faith. If you are interested in confirmation, join us tonight before dinner at 5 p.m. in the Mariposa Café.



During each Sunday of the Advent season, we focus on one of the four virtues Jesus brings us as we light the four candles of the Advent Wreath. At St. Paul we use three blue candles, and one pink candle to represent joy, along with one larger, white candle in the middle as the Christ candle. The lighting of the first candle symbolizes hope and expectation, while the second symbolizes peace, the third joy and the fourth love. The white Christ candle is lit on Christmas Eve reminding Christians that Jesus is the light of the world.

This week we focus on PEACE.

AS WE LIGHT THIS ADVENT CANDLE WE ACKNOWLEDGE THAT PEACE DOES NOT REIGN IN OUR WORLD. WE ASK, "WHO WILL SHOW US THE WAY?" IN THE LIFE AND TEACHINGS OF JESUS, THE PRINCE OF PEACE, WE FIND THE WAY TO PEACE AND JUSTICE.
