

Open Arms Resource Center

St. Paul believes we are to help our brothers and sisters when they are in need. Open Arms offers food and clothing, financial assistance for rent and utilities, and spiritual support. This ministry is currently serving about 4,000 people every month and providing food to other ministries and food pantries in our area as well. This year Open Arms collected and distributed 348,000 pounds of food to the underfed!

How You Can Help

Donate: We receive the bulk of our food through community partnerships but can always use non food items like diapers and baby items, cleaning supplies, toilet paper and other toiletries. We also take gently used clothing, linens, and shoes.
