XPerience Sunday: January 7


On the first Sunday of each month, Xperience Sunday allows fifth, eighth and twelfth graders to experience what worship is like at the next age level. On January 7 fifth graders are invited to join our Student Ministry at 5:30 p.m. in the Mariposa Café, followed by group games, worship, biblical teaching, and a chance to connect to others through Small Groups. Eighth graders join our high school group.

High school seniors are invited to join our IGNITE group for icebreakers, time to hang out and get to know each other, and a brief lesson and Q&A.



Sign Up for Confirmation

Our next Confirmation Class begins with an overnight retreat on Jan. 5 and 6. The six week class costs \$30 and is open to students in Grade 6 and above. It challenges students to ask deep questions about the Bible, our Methodist beliefs, and their own lives as people of faith. During each Sunday of the Advent season, we focus on one of the four virtues Jesus brings us as we light the four candles of the Advent Wreath. At St. Paul we use three blue candles, and one pink candle to represent joy, along with one larger, white candle in the middle as the Christ candle. The lighting of the first candle symbolizes hope and expectation, while the second symbolizes peace, the third joy and the fourth love. The white Christ candle will be lit tonight at our Candlelight Christmas Eve worship, reminding us that Jesus is the light of the world.
